1.What kind of climate does Greenland have?

Ans. Climate of Greenland:-

- i.Greenland lies in the Northern Hemisphere.
- ii.Northern Hemisphere has a very cold climate.
- iii.This region is also known as the Tundra region.
- iv.Eighty percent of Greenland is always covered with ice.
- v.Huge pieces of ice frequently break off and float in the sea. They are called icebergs. They pose great danger to ships in the sea.
- vi.The south-western coast of Greenland is the warmest part of the country. Most of the people live here.

2.What are icebergs? In what ways are they dangerous?

Ans. A very large piece of ice floating in the sea is called an iceberg. They are dangerous because icebergs are actually much larger than they seem. This is because when an iceberg floats on water, most of it remains underwater. Therefore they pose great danger to ships in the sea.

3.Describe the wildlife of Greenland.

Ans. Wildlife of Greenland:-

Only those animals that can withstand the extreme cold are found in Greenland. Among them are -
