New words and their meanings

Attic – space or room inside the roof of a building

Noisy feet - feet making a lot of noise

Dough – thick mixture of flour and water used to bake cake ,bread etc

Sweeten – to make something sweet

broom – a cleaning tool

Peg – small piece of wood that is used for fastening

Drag – pull

Galoshes – waterproof shoes, mostly worn over usual shoes
