

What are Adverbs?

- An adverb is a word that is used to **change or qualify the meaning of** an adjective, a verb, a clause, another adverb.
- Traditionally considered to be a single part of speech, adverbs perform a wide variety of functions. Adverbs normally carry out these functions by answering questions such as:

When? She always arrives early.

How? He drives carefully.

Where? They go everywhere together.

In what way? She eats slowly.

To what extent? It is terribly hot.


