Lets recap

PHRASES -

are collection of words that form part of a sentence but do not make complete sense on their own.

Read the following sentences :

1. The students are extremely attentive.
2. The speech was really impressive.
3. This bangle is very expensive.

The underlined words tells us more about the nouns. They act as adjective and describe the quality of nouns.

Adjective phrase -

is a phrase whose head word is an adjective.

It describes or tells us more about the noun or pronoun in a sentence.

- An adjective phrase usually consists of an adverb and an adjective.
- It can also have more than one adjective.
- Examples -
 - He looked very upset. (adj. - upset, adv. - very)
 - These tasks are fairly simple. (adj. - simple , adv.- fairly)
 - The burgers are cheesy and delicious. (adj. - cheesy , delicious)

1. Find out the adjective phrases and the noun phrases in the following sentences.

- a) The boy was very shy and nervous. N.P.- the boy , adj. - shy and nervous
- b) Jai and Reema looked very enthusiastic after their exams got over. N.P- Jai and Reema, adj.-enthusiastic after
- c) The tablecloth is far too big. N.P- the tablecloth, adj.- far too big
- d) Your handwriting is completely illegible. N.P- your handwriting, adj.- completely illegible
- e) The incident was unbelievable but hilarious. N.P- the incident , adj- unbelievable but hilarious
- f) The actress looked dazzlingly beautiful as she entered the hall. N.P- the actress, adj.- dazzling beautiful
- g) The residents are extremely unhappy about the frequent power cuts. N.P- the residents, adj.- frequent power cuts
