ADVERBS



The dog barks *loudly*



Snails move *slowly*


Here, the words *loudly* and *slowly* tell us how the actions are done. *Loudly* tells us how the dog *barks*. *Slowly* tells us how snails *move*. Such words are called **adverbs**.

Words that tell us how an action is done are called *adverbs*.
Most adverbs end with *ly*.

Examples:



Meena rides her bicycle carefully.



Amit reads the poem loudly.



Raju speaks quickly.



The child sleeps quietly



We should eat slowly.



I do my homework carefully.
