

Conjunctions - And, But, Or

STUDY NOTES

At a glance

- **Conjunctions** are joining words. They join words and sentences.
- We use **and** to combine two words or sentences into one and also to add information.
- Example- Apple is healthy **and** tasty.
- The conjunction **but** is used to join two sentences that talk about things or ideas that are different from each other.
- Example- Mohan wants to play outside, **but** it is raining.
- **Or** joins two sentences that talk about different choices.
- Example- Do you want cake **or** chocolate?

A **conjunction** is a word which joins together sentences, and sometimes words.
