There are three articles in English: **a, an, the** .




A

We use **a** before nouns that begin with consonant.




Examples

1. Raj saw a snake in the garden.
2. The animals want a king for them.



An

We use **an** before nouns that begin with vowel sounds .



Examples

There is an egg in the nest.
We use an umbrella when it rains.



THE

The is used before singular and plural nouns when the noun is specific or particular.

The Taj Mahal



The Kaveri

After the long day, the cup of tea tasted particularly good.



Here, it was one specific day that was long and one specific cup of tea that tasted good.


