# Possessive Adjectives and Possessive Pronouns

# POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

A possessive pronoun is a pronoun that is used to indicate possession or ownership.

- This pen is **my pen**, not **your pen**.  
    ↓                      ↓
- This pen is **mine**, not **yours**.



**MINE**

- This is my laptop. It's **mine**.

# Possessive Adjectives

- ▶ Possessive adjectives are used to express the idea of belonging and possession.
- ▶ **My** house means the house belonging to me.  
**Your** homework means the homework you are doing.
- ▶ We use possessive adjectives before nouns:  
**my** book      **his** exam      **their** car
