

**What is literary device?**

**Ans) The literary device is a technique a writer uses to produce a special effect in his/her writing.**

**What is personification?**

**Ans) Personification is a literary device in which human characteristics or attributes are given to animals, birds or objects. These characteristics could be human emotions, gestures, thoughts or actions.**

**Personifications in the poem.**

**Ans) Sunshine, bluebird, brook, dandelions, river, meadow and bee are some of the personifications used in the poem.**






