# What is a conditional?

A **conditional** is a sentence or part of a sentence that expresses a condition.

It usually begins with the words "when," "if" and "unless".

A condition is what must happen before something else can happen.



# ZERO CONDITIONAL

Structure

Usage

Examples

If + Present Simple, .... Present Simple.

To talk about things that are always true, or scientific facts

If you **heat** butter, it **melts**.

I **get** tired if I **exercise** hard.

# First Conditional

## Structure

### IF + Simple Present, Simple Future

(S + will/won't + V(bare form))

## Usage

To talk about possibilities in the present or in the future

## Examples

- If it **rains**, I **will stay** at home.
- If I **wake** up late, I **will miss** the bus.
- And, if it's sunny, we'll **go** to the park.
- If Juan **leaves**, Paula **will be** sad.
- If I **find** your email, I **will send** you the picture.
- If you **study** hard, you **will pass** your exams.



# SECOND CONDITIONAL



Structure

Usage

Examples



## IF+ Past Simple, Present Conditional

(To be: use WERE) (would/wouldn't + Verb (bare form)).

**Imaginary situations in the present or future**

- If I **won** a million dollars, I **would buy** a new car.
- If I **were** you, I **would quit** smoking.
- If I **were** the president, I **would lower** taxes.
- They **would stay** longer if they **had** more time.
- If I **won** a million dollars, I **could stop** working.
- If I **had** more free time, I **could travel** around the world.

# THIRD CONDITIONAL

Structure

**IF + Past Perfect, Perfect Conditional**

(Would/wouldn't + have + Past Participle)

Usage

**Imaginary situations in the past**

Examples

- If I **had got** a gold medal, I **would have been** happy.
- If I **had met** Susan last week, I **would have given**
